Family Conversation Topics and Dates

Conversation One: Parenting in the 21st Century

September 7, 2017

Discuss the realities of raising children in the 21st century. The conversation will include the important roles that parents/caregivers play at an early age in their children's future academic success.

Conversation Two: Raising Successful Boys

September 21, 2017

This conversation will focus on how to help and support boys to be successful.

Conversation Three: Raising Successful Girls

October 26, 2017

This conversation will focus on how to help and support girls to be successful.

Conversation Four: Trauma

November 30, 2017

Join an important discussion about ways to help and support all victims of trauma, both children and adults. We will discuss the importance of making sure that children receive access to all the resources and supports needed for their academic success. This conversation will address myths and non-myths about trauma.

Conversation Five: Working as Partners with Schools

January 18, 2018

During this conversation we will discuss strategies, suggestions, and recommendations for parents/caregivers to work closely and cooperatively with school personnel to help create success for their children.

Conversation Six: Preparing for College

February 8, 2018
